## Notes from Friends

The first article on history and the Comprehensive Plan introduced "Visioning and Alternative Futures" and Mandatory Elements. These documents then are to be consistent with the 13 mandated State Growth Management Goals and Planning Policies. So what are the Mandatory Elements and Planning Policies?

Working with the cities in Skagit County the County Wide Planning Policies (CWPP) are statements as to what course of action is to be taken to support the GMA Goals, i.e., compact urban growth, reduction of sprawling development in rural areas, the protection of resource lands with a focus on land use. There are four general categories to be considered. – Urban, Rural, Resource Lands (industrial Agriculture and Forests) and Open Space. More of the goals will be included in a follow-up article in a future newsletter.

The Unified Development Codes (UDC) are the requirements necessary to establish planning policies, zoning and density of development that is to be permitted for each land use designation as found in land use criteria and development rights policies. Public process and the permitting of development applications are complex processes. Regulations for development must be coordinated among various departments including Skagit County Public Works, Health Department, Planning and Permitting, as well as Skagit's city and county jurisdictions that are concerned about managing growth.

Any citizen can participate in the public process individually or as a group, and if there is an issue that appears to not be in compliance with the mandated goals and policies the issue can be introduced at a Planning Commission Public Hearing. A Planning Commission is made up of volunteer citizens who make recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners or to the respective city councils for their approval and adoption into law.

After adoption, if there remains an issue that may not be in compliance with the GMA goals or Policies, a citizen may file an appeal to the State Growth Management Hearings Board (GMHB), a semi-judicial body. The decision of the GMHB then approves or directs the local governing body to draft corrections for public review and process. As you can see this is a time consuming process but one that assures there is open government by the people and for the people.

Once the language of the County (or city) Comprehensive Plan, Policies and Development codes is adopted, applications for individual projects are submitted. In Washington State, as in most places in the U.S., a project can legally be built wherever the zoning ordinance of a community allows the type of development.
